2022 LEGISLATIVE NOTES

The ninth and final week of the 2022 Legislative Session is now complete. On behalf of your Association, this week I was busy carefully monitoring the funding bill to the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund, **HB 1306**. As will be explained below, the members and leadership of your Association should be happy with the success your Association had at the Capital this year.

As stated in my last several newsletters, **HB 1306** has been an important bill for your Association to support as it moved through the legislature. **HB 1306**, **An Act to make an appropriation to rural access infrastructure funds and to declare an emergency**, was heard on the Senate floor after having passed the Senate Committee on Appropriations last week unanimously with a funding of \$25 million.

While on the floor, like many of the funding bills, it was again amended to an amount of \$1. The Senators amended the funding bills to \$1 to see how the budget and numbers conclude prior to making any final appropriation decisions for bills such as HB 1306. Because of this, the House did not concur and voted in favor of appointing a conference committee.

By Wednesday, this conference committee had an opportunity to meet and made the decision to amend the bill back to \$25 million and over the course of three years as opposed to five years originally proposed. This final version of the bill was adopted by both chambers allowing its passage. It now awaits on the Governor's desk for her signature.

Next, **HB 1155**, An Act to revise the compensation for a township board member overseer, has been signed by Governor.

Finally, **HB 1156**, An Act to revise provisions regarding weed removal along highways, has been delivered to the Governor's desk on March 10, 2022.

The above referenced Township bills do not include the other several bills your Association has continually monitored and testified in favor or against in the previous weeks. I would encourage you to review previous newsletters to further appreciate the impact and success your Association had at the Capital this legislative session.

It was an honor being able to represent your Association at the Capital during this Legislative Session. Your leadership and members should be proud of what was accomplished considering the legislative process can often times be difficult and frustrating to navigate. The last main event of the 2022 Legislative Session is Veto Day which will take place on March 28. Your Association leadership and I will monitor HB 1155 and HB 1156 to ensure their being signed by the Governor and not appearing on Veto Day.

I appreciate having worked for your Association and look forward to what the next Legislative Session will bring for your Association.


