LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The ninth and final week of the 99th legislative session is complete. While there were ups and down, particularly with SB 201, your Association ultimately had a successful legislative session by passing a couple bills that improve

the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund.

Your Association leadership and I spent most of the week continuing to monitor **SB 201.** If you recall, your Association initially testified in opposition to SB 201 in the Senate committee due to a provision taking away local control from townships and counties. Later, your Association leadership did not testify on SB 201 in the House committee due to an amendment having passed that removed the provision stating townships would be prevented from passing or enforcing an ordinance that regulates, restricts, or prohibits a gas or liquid transmission line or an electric transmission line.

Unfortunately, after the bill passed the House committee and floor, it was again heavily amended to incorporate provisions from a couple other pipeline bills. This amendment also includes language from one of the earlier drafts that restricts townships and local control.

This was a result of the House and Senate each appointing members to a conference committee in which they try to come to a "happy ground" between the chambers. The conference committee process can feel frustrating as they did not allow further testimony from proponents or opponents. Instead, the conference committee and chambers focused on what they thought would pass in both chambers and be sent to the Governor's desk.

The good news is that your Association had another successful year of improving the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund. **SB 188,** An Act to modify the time before which

rural access infrastructure grant moneys must be expended or obligated, was signed by the Governor on February 28, 2024.

Next, **SB 124**, a bill that would amend the law to include minimum maintenance roads to be eligible for the rural access infrastructure fund, was sent to the Governor's desk for her signature on March 6th.

While the decision was made to not move forward with **SB 189** this year due to significant concerns by many different groups, your Association leadership and I intend to work with the appropriate individuals and groups this coming Summer and Fall to discuss a viable bill that will work for most of the interested parties.

It has been a pleasure to watch your Association continue to gain momentum with the passage of many bills over the past several years. The official legislative session is done but there is a lot of work needed to be done in the "offseason" for next year's legislative session which would include the request of additional money for the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund.

As is the case every year, I appreciated the opportunity to represent your Association at the 99th legislative session.




