# 2024 LEGISLATIVE NOTES

The 99<sup>th</sup> South Dakota Legislative Session opened on January 9th, 2023, with many legislators beginning their second year of session. As always, your Association and I will be working diligently this legislative session to improve townships across the State of South Dakota.

For it only being the first week of session, there are a high number of bills with 88 House Bills and 82 Senate Bills introduced to date. This session is expected to have a significant number of bills between the House and Senate, meaning that it will be a busy time for your Association and many others.

Governor Noem presented her annual State of the State address on Tuesday, January 9th, 2023. Throughout her State of the State address, she provided her "Top Ten List" of things that support her Freedom Works in South Dakota campaign. This included the freedom to keep and bear arms, freedom to enjoy the outdoors, freedom to farm and ranch, freedom to be secure, freedom get a second chance, freedom to be respected, freedom to learn, freedom to be healthy, freedom for life, and the freedom to work.

At this point there have a been a couple of bills introduced that may be of interest to your Association. First, of interest may be **SB 4** which seeks to increase the amount authorized without advertising for bids for snow removal from \$3500 dollars to \$10,000 dollars. It should be noted this increase is relating to the snow removal reserve fund as authorized by SDCL 31-13-26. This bill was heard in Senate Local Government on January 12, 2024, passed 5-0, and was placed on the consent calendar.

**SB 37** is also a bill that members of your Association may want to monitor. This bill states that in the event the township does not maintain <u>mail routes</u>, the county's expenses

incurred in maintaining the <u>mail</u> routes when a township fails to do so, shall increase from an amount not to exceed \$200 each mile each year to \$2500 each mile each year. This bill was brought due to the \$200 limit originating from 1955 legislation. This bill was heard in Senate Local Government on January 12, 2024, passed 5-0, and was placed on the consent calendar.

Your Association will once again introduce several bills this legislative session. One bill will push back the reversionary period for the funds distributed in the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund a year for each distributed amount in 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024. The purpose of this bill is to ensure that the funds distributed to the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund have more time to be used for townships and counties rather than revert back to the general budget.

Your Association is also introducing a bill which would allow all maintained roads to be potentially eligible for the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund rather than only full maintenance roads. It should be noted that the townships will still have to have met one of the two requirements of imposing a tax levy or opt out before they are eligible to apply for the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund grant.

Next, your Association is introducing a bill to require townships to be involved with the county special permit process from the beginning. Finally, your Association will be working with the counties to address the issue of annexation by municipalities and the roads that are left to be maintained by the counties and townships.

I will be diligently working with your Association leadership as your Association's legislation continues to develop and eventually be introduced.

This is an exciting time – as well as very busy – for many interest groups and Associations, including yours. I appreciate the opportunity once again to represent your Association's best interest during the 99<sup>th</sup> legislative session.


