2023 LEGISLATIVE NOTES

The fifth week of legislative session is complete! It was another busy week at the legislature for everyone including your Association. The legislators used the fifth week to work though bills in committees and on the floor to get through as many bills as possible prior to Crossover Day on February 22, 2023.

Your Association leadership and I continue to monitor various bills of interest to your Association. As stated last week, several bills have been introduced with the goal of reducing the sales tax on food. **HB 1075**, which would eliminate the sales tax on food, was referred to House Committee on Appropriations on January 26, 2023, by a vote of 12-1. **HB 1095**, which reduces the tax on food to two and one-half percent was referred to the House Committee on Appropriations on Thursday by a vote of 11-0. However, **HB 1096**, which reduces the tax on food to three and one-half percent, was tabled on Thursday by a vote of 10-1.

Next, **HB 1137**, An Act to reduce certain gross receipts tax rates and a use tax rate, and to repeal a conditional reduction of certain gross receipts tax rates, was referred to House Committee on Appropriations by a vote of 12 yays and 0 nays on January 31, 2023. **SB 162**, which modifies the public meeting requirements, has made its way to the House Local Government after easily passing the Senate with Amendment 162A.

The couple of bills introduced to help landowners as it relates to condemnation of land for pipelines, **HB 1188** and **HB 1202**, after having been killed and withdrawn respectively. **SB 150**. a bill that relates to livestock pipelines, passed the Senate floor on February 3, 2023 and has been referred to House Ag and Natural Resources on February 7, 2023.

Your Association's legislation has again continued to make progress this week. **SB 73**, which allows townships who own their self-propelled machinery equipment and vehicles to be exempt from the fuel excise tax, passed House Taxation on Tuesday by a vote of 9-0 and was placed on consent calendar. **SB 73** was then passed on the House floor by a vote of 68-0 and is now on its way to the Governor's desk and will likely be signed soon.

Next, **HB 1147**, An Act to provide for the organization of townships or fractions of townships, passed House Local Government 13-0 and was placed on consent, allowing it to be easily passed on the House floor on Wednesday by a vote of 68-0.

HB 1148, An Act to clarify registration and residence requirements for voting at a township meeting, was a little more interesting. Like HB 1147, HB 1148 was heard in House Local Government. A couple legislators expressed an unfairness that an individual could not vote in a township they have land but do not reside. There was also some frustrations with the class 2 misdemeanor as opposed to a harsher penalty. Regardless, HB 1148 passed the committee by a vote of 8-5.

I spent much of Wednesday lobbying the bill in preparation for its floor hearing that afternoon. To help clear up any misunderstandings related to the class 2 misdemeanor, Representative Chase amended the bill. With its amendment, **HB 1148** passed the House floor by a vote of 57-10.

Finally, **SB 145**, your Association's bill relating to rural access infrastructure eligibility, passed the Senate floor on Monday by a vote of 28-7. It has since been referred to House Taxation and will likely be heard sometime after Crossover Day.

It is crazy to believe that session is halfway done. Your leadership and I will continue to work diligently so that your bills can continue to thrive through the legislative session.
