2025 LEGISLATIVE NOTES

The 100th South Dakota Legislative Session opened on January 14th, 2025, with many new legislators and a governorship likely coming to an end due to Governor Kristi Noem being appointed as Secretary of Homeland Security by President Donald Trump. Your Association will be busy this session attempting to lobby for additional funding for the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund.

The current bill count is 69 House bills and 78 Senate bills introduced to date. As for every legislative session, these numbers will increase dramatically in the coming weeks as legislators have until February 5, 2025, to introduce individual bills and resolutions.

In Governor Noem's State of the State address, she provided ten reasons as to why South Dakota will continue to be successful in the future which includes the people, values, freedoms, and economy. Additionally, Governor Noem publicly acknowledged this would likely be her final legislative session as Governor as she was nominated by President Trump to be the Secretary of Homeland Security. Governor Noem stated that she had the utmost confidence in Lt. Governor Larry Rhoden and that she intentionally chose him as her running mate in the event he was required to take over as Governor.

At this point there have a been a few bills introduced that may be of interest to your Association. First, your Association may want to follow **HB 1059**. HB 1059 would amend existing open meeting laws to clarify that it is not an official meeting of a public body if its members communicate via teleconference or other electronic means

for the sole purpose of scheduling or confirming availability to attend a future meeting. Next, **SB 45** would impose an additional two-dollar motor vehicle registration fee per transaction for the purposes of creating and utilizing a motor vehicle technology fund. Finally, **SB 74** would require all political subdivisions to take time in their first official public meeting of every calendar year to review the open meeting laws as published by the attorney general's office.

Your Association will again focus on funding for RAIF as the session progresses. I have been working with your Association leadership and legislative committee to draft a bill that would provide additional funding to RAIF. As drafted, the bill states that 25 million dollars would be equally distributed to RAIF in 2026, 2027, and 2028. This bill is modeled after HB 1036 in 2022's legislative session which passed overwhelmingly. After communicating with different legislators, Senator Sydney Davis and Representative Marty Overweg agreed to be the prime sponsors in the Senate and House respectfully. At this point, I will work with the legislators and the LRC to finalize the funding bill prior to it being finalized and published.

Once the draft of the bill is published, your Association leadership and I will be working diligently to approach various legislators, groups, and departments to lobby in favor of the bill's passing.

This is an exciting time for many organizations, groups, and Associations, including yours. I appreciate the opportunity once again to represent your Association's best interest during the 100th legislative session.
