2023 LEGISLATIVE NOTES

The eighth week of legislative session is complete. Session is almost complete and your Association had a fantastic legislative week.

Your Association's bills came to a happy conclusion this week. **SB 73**, which allows townships who own their self-propelled machinery equipment and vehicles to be exempt from the fuel excise tax, was signed by the Governor on February 22, 2023.

HB 1147 is still awaiting the Governor's signature which can be expected soon. **HB 1148**, An Act to registration and residence requirements for voting at a township meeting, was signed by the President and will soon be headed to the Governor's desk.

Finally, the bill of most consequence to your Association this year – **SB 145** – passed House Taxation by a vote of 10-1 on March 28, 2023, and then passed the House floor by a vote of 68-0 on March 1, 2023. Representative Overweg introduced **SB 145** and then your Association's President Dustin Leiseth provided the main testimony. Their testimony was compelling and without any opposition testimony, the bill passed to the Governor's desk strongly.

As the legislature wraps up, there are bills that may be of interest to your Association that have continued to move through the legislature or have been killed as well. **HB 1137,** An Act to reduce certain gross receipts tax rates and a use tax rate, and to repeal a conditional reduction of certain gross receipts tax rates, passed Senate Taxation on

February 27, 2023, by a vote of 6-0 with Amendment 1137C. Amendment 1137C adds a "sunset clause" to end the sales tax reduction on June 30, 2025. **SB 150** was signed by the Governor into law on March 2, 2023.

Although there is one week of legislative session left, your Association is able to reflect upon the success it has already achieved at this point. Your Association introduced four bills and all four have passed and have either been signed by the Governor or will hopefully be signed soon.

It has been an honor to assist in the passage of these bills; though, most of the "thanks" belongs to your Association's leadership as they provided clear direction as it relates to the bills introduced in legislature. I will continue to monitor your bill's hopeful "signage" next week and possibly beyond.
